I am writing this book to document the Texas Martingales, and record what I have been able to learn about them.

In Oct. 1987, while metal detecting a site where Gen. Cabell's command camped prior to the Battle of Devil's Backbone, I unearthed the 1st specimen I had seen. Since then I have kept a record of every specimen I have ran across.

From what I have found out, I now believe the martingales were 1st made in Texas, and then the distribution spread into Indian Terr., about the time of the Civil War, from these places I believe they found their way to other Trans Mississippi sites.


I have no record of any specimens being found on post Civil War sites,






These specimens were attached to 3 of the 4 corners of an early Mother Hubbard saddle from Wichita Falls Tx.








